The 2023 Ararat Junior Public Speaking Team consisted of Oli Reynolds, Alyssa Townsend, Mackenzie Johnson and Ella Clark. On Friday the 4th of August they bundled nervously and excitedly into the school car and travelled down to the Ararat Cinema for the Legacy Junior Public Speaking Competition, where they were welcomed warmly by members of Ararat Legacy. A very big thank you to Ararat Legacy for organising, hosting and funding this event so that students can have such an important opportunity. Thank you



also to Kevin Bowles for being an integral part of this event.

Ella was first to speak, expounding the value of self-sacrifice in pursuit of your passion — in Ella's case, this involved many hours of practice and dealing with injuries in the world of dance. Oli Reynolds spoke on the importance of knowing about different wars in our history, to appreciate the sacrifices made for the freedoms we enjoy today, and also to learn the values taught by those who fought and learn the lessons required to avoid the extreme examples of inhumanity that have manifested themselves in war, particularly in the Holocaust. Mackenzie Johnson encouraged the audience to explore "a kaleidoscope" of experiences, to participate and be involved in many different pursuits, as a means of finding out what you are made of. Alyssa Townsend reminded us that devoting yourself to sport was not just about fitness, but that it is also a means of developing leadership and commitment which can lead to bigger and greater things. Her example of Cathy Freeman coming from very humble beginnings and becoming a person who captured Australia's heart in spite of the challenges she faced, was much appreciated by the judges.

We are extremely proud of all four students for having a go and doing such an incredible job in public speaking. They had a mere two weeks to prepare, working at home and giving up lunch times to practice. These four students represented the commitment and hard work that young people across our school have time and again demonstrated. Thank you Oli, Alyssa, Ella and Mackenzie for showing what our school is made of. Continue to inspire others and take on challenges that come your way.

machine to laser cut rocket fins/nozzles and engrave designs.



One of them was driving. One of them was high. One of them screamed. And one of them died.



The twisty, gripping thriller you won't want to put down!




