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## Girls in Stem Excursion

On Tuesday and Wednesday last week six year 8 and 9 students participated in a two day STEM course that enabled them to challenge their abilities to solve real life problems and learn some new skills.

For the introduction to stem we played some mini games in groups and then we had a meeting about what was happening that day and what we were going to do. One of the activities we did at stem was a problem solving activity where we had to figure out how to get items out of a grate with material you can find lying around. This activity was very exciting and we did a lot of team building. **By Acacia** 

At the Girls' STEM there were 4 activities that we completed during the day. My first activity was VR or visual reality. When we started, we learned about the different components that were required to operate the VR. Once we had learnt how to operate the VR we got to play a game. The game that we played had different scenarios that we could view. You could explore space, a mountainside with a robot dog or shoot arrows at Vikings invading your castle. After the game we got to explore Google Earth. When you started there were default places like New York or Paris. You could search for a country or town you wanted to visit or try to find your house or school.

On the second day a team from MARS confectionary spoke to the students about a real-life problem that they had to solve. When Maltesers are made, they often clump together, and the problem was how to sort the perfect from the not so perfect. Using the laser cutter and their imaginations students were asked to create a mock design of how they would solve this problem.
