GAT Preparation



Behaviour Management Policy Changes

Please be aware of the following changes to our behaviour management policy as of week 8:

- If a student is exited to a timeout room, a message will be sent to the student's parents to inform them of the student's behaviour.
- If a student is exited from the same class twice in a week, this will result in an automatic after school detention.

The following consequences remain in place:

- A lunch detention will follow for a student exited for the first or second time in a week (if they
 are not exited from the same class).
- An after school detention will follow for any student exited three times in a week.
- A suspension may follow for any student exited four or more times in a week.

Attendance

School attendance is important and we have included a brief overview of our requirements. Please contact the college office if you have any concerns with this process.

All students are expected to attend school every day and arrive at all scheduled lessons and activities on time. Rolls are marked electronically by all staff for each lesson of the day. Parents can monitor their attendance live via the Xuno parent portal.

Students are expected to remain in the college grounds during the school day, unless they have written permission from a parent or guardian to attend an appointment.

- <u>All</u> students must sign in or out via the General Office if they are late to school or need to leave early.
- Students <u>will not</u> be given permission to go down the street for the sole purpose of buying lunch.

The Department of Education requires a valid reason be given to the school for <u>ALL</u> student absences.

If your child is absent an SMS will be sent to your mobile phone asking for an explanation.

This can be given:

- via attendance notification in the parent portal
- via a return SMS
- via a phone call to the College
- via written note explaining an absence (blank notes are in the diary) on the day your child returns.



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These new novels both focus on the theme of war and are now available in the library,




Renowned for her historical fiction titles, Jackie French now tells the story of the brilliant and famous evacuation of Gallipoli. Sixteen-year-old Nipper and his Gallipoli mates Lanky, Spud, Bluey and Wallaby Joe are starving, freezing and ill-equipped. By November 1915 they know that that there is more to winning a war than courage. The Gallipoli campaign has been lost. Nipper has played cricket with the Turks in the opposing dugout, dodged rocket fire and rescued desperate and drowning men when the blizzard snow melted. He is one of the few trusted with the secret kept from even most of the officers: how an entire army will vanish from the Peninsula over three impeccably planned nights. Based on first-hand

accounts of those extraordinary last weeks of the Gallipoli campaign, this is the fascinating 'lost story' of how 150,000 men - and their horses and equipment - were secretly moved to waiting ships without a single life lost. An unforgettable story told through the eyes of a boy who lied about his age to defend his country.

'You could see the pilot as he came past, immobile, seconds to eternity.' As a teenager, Cliff dreams that one day he will play cricket for Australia, but when war comes he changes cricket whites for a navy uniform.

Leaving everything he knows behind, he faces new horrors every day, from exploding mines and submarine attacks to deliberate suicide attacks by kamikaze pilots, never knowing if he will see his sweetheart, Marie, again.

But amongst all the tragedy of war, Cliff finds something he never thought possible amidst all the fear and devastation ... hope.

Camps Sports and Excursions Fund Reminder

Ararat College would like to remind parents and families that the cut off for CSEF applications is the 23rd of June.

Eligible secondary school students can receive \$225 up to the age of 18 years to be used specifically for students to undertake Camps and Excursions. Payments will go directly to the school and be tied to the student.

Who is eligible?

 Families holding one or more of the eligible financially means test cards OR be a temporary foster parent

Special Considerations

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care
 If you feel you are eligible to receive the above payment and have not made a claim yet, please
 contact the college office and we will happily assist you.
