Smoking Ceremony

In celebration of Reconciliation Week, Ararat College had the privilege of experiencing a smoking ceremony performed by Paul Kelly from Eastern Maar. Smoking ceremonies have been performed by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people for thousands of years and involve the burning of damp leaves from native trees to create a fragrant smoke, and can be used in welcome, celebration, birth, deaths, and to cleanse bad energy and spirits. Paul spoke to students and staff about some local culture and language before performing the didgeridoo and smoking ceremony. It was a very special cultural experience and Ararat College is thankful to have the knowledge of Paul to continue to learn about our local Aboriginal people.

GAT Preparation



Senior Formal





It's National Reconciliation Week - a time for all Australians to learn about First Nations people's histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.


These novels honour the voices, histories and cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.



Heartfelt and poignant, this coming of age story explores father-son relationships, against a backdrop of small town rivalries, buried truths, with themes of sustainability, preserving the past and environmental care.

Matthew and his mum move to the coast, so his mum - an artist - can renovate her late father's old place to sell it and get them back on their feet. Matthew strikes up a friendship with Old Bill, an Indigenous man who becomes a father figure to him, and teaches him how to find and eat pippis, fish (and to make a few dollars from it). But when his Dad moves back in with the family, his anger fractures the newfound peace and everything is once again at stake, and in peril.

Nothing's been the same for Beth Teller since she died. Her dad, a detective, is the only one who can see and hear her - and he's drowning in grief. But now they have a mystery to solve together. Who is Isobel Catching, and what's her connection to the fire that killed a man? What happened to the people who haven't been seen since the fire? As Beth unravels the mystery, she finds a shocking story lurking beneath the surface of a small town, and a friendship that lasts beyond one life and into another. Told in two unforgettable voices, this gripping novel interweaves themes of grief, colonial history, violence, love and family.

Camps Sports and Excursions Fund Reminder

Ararat College would like to remind parents and families that the cut off for CSEF applications is the 23rd of June.

Eligible secondary school students can receive \$225 up to the age of 18 years to be used specifically for students to undertake Camps and Excursions. Payments will go directly to the school and be tied to the student.

Who is eligible?

Families holding one or more of the eligible financially means test cards OR be a temporary foster parent

Special Considerations

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care
