

# **Attendance**

School attendance is important and we have included a brief overview of our requirements. Please contact the college office if you have any concerns with this process.

All students are expected to attend school every day and arrive at all scheduled lessons and activities on time. Rolls are marked electronically by all staff for each lesson of the day. Parents can monitor their attendance live via the Xuno parent portal.

Students are expected to remain in the college grounds during the school day, unless they have written permission from a parent or guardian to attend an appointment.

- <u>All</u> students must sign in or out via the General Office if they are late to school or need to leave early.
- Students <u>will not</u> be given permission to go down the street for the sole purpose of buying lunch.

# The Department of Education requires a valid reason be given to the school for <u>ALL</u> student absences.


If your child is absent an SMS will be sent to your mobile phone asking for an explanation.

This can be given:

- via attendance notification in the parent portal
- via a return SMS
- via a phone call to the College
- via written note explaining an absence (blank notes are in the diary) on the day your child returns.

# These new novels are now available in the library.




Six teenagers. An empty shopping centre. No Wi-Fi. And ... a baby?

With no phones, no internet and no way out, Shannon and five other trapped teens are completely disconnected from the outside world ... and their online lives. It's hard to say whether they'll be driven to delinquency, or - even worse - forced to make friends IRL.

Will the limitless bubble tea, Maccas and new sneakers be enough to keep the six teens satisfied until they can find a way out, or is this the start of something much more sinister?

The city authorities have abandoned the D-Zone as damaged beyond repair. It's a no-go area where ongoing earthquakes threaten to destroy what's left. But Jonah and Bas and everyone else trying to survive in the devastation there can't leave - they're 'illegals', without citizenship, without rights. Jonah can see the quakes before the ground shudders and grinds, before the buildings fall. Glimpsing is a rare ability and a great survival asset ... and it has attracted the attention of powers keen to exploit it.

When Bas disappears, Jonah knows his friend is in great danger. He knows that his glimpsing offers a way to bring new hope to the people of the D-Zone. But Jonah's plan will push everything, including his own life, to the brink.


