## **Behaviour Management Policy Changes**

Please be aware of the following changes to our behaviour management policy as of week 8:

- If a student is exited to a timeout room, a message will be sent to the student's parents to inform them of the student's behaviour.
- If a student is exited from the same class twice in a week, this will result in an automatic after school detention.

The following consequences remain in place:

- A lunch detention will follow for a student exited for the first or second time in a week (if they are not exited from the same class).
- An after school detention will follow for any student exited three times in a week.
- A suspension may follow for any student exited four or more times in a week.




"I'll make it clear from the start: I did not kill Hugh Henry Van Boren. I didn't even help. Well, not intentionally."

# **Camps Sports and Excursions Fund Reminder**

Ararat College would like to remind parents and families that the cut off for CSEF applications is the 23rd of June.

Eligible secondary school students can receive \$225 up to the age of 18 years to be used specifically for students to undertake Camps and Excursions. Payments will go directly to the school and be tied to the student.

### Who is eligible?

 Families holding one or more of the eligible financially means test cards OR be a temporary foster parent

### **Special Considerations**

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care
