The survey will be conducted online and only takes 20 minutes to complete. It can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. 
2022 School Magazine Available on Xuno

The 2022 Edition of Orana, our school's magazine, is now available on Xuno. The digital copy of Orana gives everyone a chance to look back on all the great memories from last year!


A big thank you goes to Miss Sky who coordinated the production of last year's magazine. This is no small feat and Miss Sky has done, as always, an absolutely brilliant job.

Freya's world is turned upside down when she and her mum move to inner-city Melbourne. Now she's stuck...


Stuck in a new apartment on the eleventh floor and Freya is afraid of lifts.

Year 12 Chemistry Excursion

On Thursday 27 July, Ararat College Year 12 Chemistry students visited the Environmental Sustainability Centre, Ecolinc, in Bacchus Marsh to complete work on their most recent assessment task. Students learned about different classes of organic compounds, how they were used as precursors in the manufacture of medications such as aspirin, and analysed a variety of analgesic tablet using specialist equipment including an Infra-red Spectrometer and a High-Performance Liquid Chromatography machine.
